EXPANSION OF CARE AND SERVICES

Inpatient Hospice Unit

Providence has filled a critical need for hospice services in the region with the opening of an inpatient hospice unit - only the second in the District of Columbia - to serve an aging population with compassionate care at the end of life. Operated by Capital Caring, this 14-bed inpatient hospice unit will also serve as a teaching site for fellows training in hospice care.

MIHU Achieves International Baby-Friendly® Designation

Providence has become the first community-based safety net hospital in Washington, D.C. to be designed as a Baby-Friendly® hospital – one of less than 350 hospitals and birthing centers in the United States to be so honored with this prestigious international distinction. The Baby-Friendly Hospital Initiative is a global program sponsored by the World Health Organization and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) to recognize hospitals that offer an optimal level of care for infant feeding and mother/baby bonding. Enhancements to patient care include breastfeeding education and training programs for mothers and families, assisting other hospitals to encourage breastfeeding, expansion to the lactation program and training for all staff nurses on breastfeeding assistance and support.

Pope Francis Emergency Care Center

Our expanded ECC allows us to treat more than 60,000 patients a year. Our increased staff of board-certified physicians, ER nurses, and technicians is specially trained to respond to a wide range of emergency and acute conditions that occur daily, and do so in the most compassionate manner possible.

The third floor of Seton House provides inpatient behavioral health services to patients who meet criteria for inpatient psychiatry and co-occurring disorders. Seton House also continues its efforts to build an Integrated Care Model and strengthen its collaborations with community partners.

PROVIDENCE PARTNERS WITH THREE FEDERALLY QUALIFIED HEALTH CENTERS

Providence has a commitment to the community to be there not only when they need to be hospitalized, but to also meet them where they live to keep them healthy.

Community of Hope, Mary’s Center, and Unity Health Care are Providence partners. We work together to help ensure our shared patients receive well-coordinated and efficiently managed services in their own neighborhoods. Providence physicians and nurse-midwives see patients at these centers. Services include direct patient care, on-call and consultation services and rehabilitation/physical therapy.

Providence oversees Unity Health Care’s Family Residents Program. This program prepares physicians for community-based medicine. Providence sends its specialists including surgeons, orthopedists, podiatrists, ob/gyn’s and infectious disease physicians to the centers where our shared patients are at home.

We look forward to broadening these partnerships with attention to behavioral health integration, transition to care, mammography services and homelessness prevention.
